## Insular Life holds Anti-Money Laundering courses

Insular Life affirmed its commitment to combat money laundering by holding Anti-Money Laundering (AML) refresher orientation courses for company personnel with AML-related functions.

Speakers from the Anti-Money Laundering Council (AMLC) conducted the half-day learning sessions. AMLC officers Atty. Rommel D. Trijo of Legal Services Group and Atty. Evangeline C. Suazo of Compliance and Investigation Group discussed the salient points of the AML law, implementing rules, circulars and advisories. They expounded on the regulations by discussing sample cases and industry-specific vulnerabilities. They emphasized the need for Effective Customer Identification Program, timely Reporting of Covered Transactions and Suspicious Transactions and on-going AML Trainings.

Animportantpartofthecourse is the Hands-On Training of participants using the company's SUKI Diaries and Servicing Customer Request Electronic Tracking System (SeCRETS) for automated procedures on reporting of the following:

- Unusual transactions, as defined in the Company's Revised AML Guidelines;
- 2. Politically Exposed Persons (PEP);

- Individuals included in the United Nations Sanctions List as endorsed by AMLC; and
- 4. Individuals with increased risk to money laundering.

This part of the course was conducted by Compliance Specialist Chariz Remli V. Dauigoy of the Legal and Corporate Services Division.

Participants from Branch Management Division, Policyholders Services Division, Audit Staff, Finance Division, Legal and Corporate Services Division, and New Business Division attended the sessions held on June 17, July 8, and September 6, 2016. Compliance Unit Head, Atty. Analyn Benito, acted as over-all coordinator and moderator during the sessions.

The final session for 2016 will be held on November 18, 2016.
